I am happy to announce that the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency has published online our 'Principles for an Energy Water Future.' This two-page document lists what we believe are six principles to guide us all toward a more sustainable energy and water future.

We know that many of your organizations have long been focused on the energy-water nexus as a key component of sustainability and an important part of managing our nation's water and energy infrastructure. The EPA also recognizes that the energy-water nexus has a direct impact on water and air quality as well, such as energy's impact on water, and water's energy footprint as it impacts air quality.

The principles are easily recognizable: water and energy efficiency, a water-wise energy sector, an energy-wise water sector, viewing wastewater as a source of renewable resources, integrated resource planning, and maximizing social benefits.
