This quarter's edition spotlights EPA's rescission of procedural rules adopted by the previous administration that directly impact its rulemaking authority, a recent court decision expanding the scope of a CERCLA exemption for air releases, and Congress's own foray into the rulemaking arena via its Congressional Review Act authority, as well as one state's efforts to bring more certainty to the role of environmental justice in air permitting.
