The session will examine the prevalence of labor trafficking across industries and the heightened vulnerabilities of certain at-risk populations. The discussion will also explore how to develop and implement trauma-informed HR practices, conduct effective supply chain due diligence, and incorporate robust anti-trafficking provisions and safeguards into contracts and broader business operations.
