- Current state of NCAA and state attorneys general NIL enforcement activity and the current litigation the NCAA is facing, including a robust discussion of House v. NCAA and potential settlement and the potential for student-athletes to be reclassified as employees
- State of the NCAA after House v. NCAA and likely enforcement trends to come in 2024 and beyond
