But if the FDA does not enforce those requirements against companies that choose to ignore them, it disincentivizes law-abiding companies from investing resources in the process.

Don't panic. Although the FDA has proposed — and apparently intends to propose — product standards that would have a significant impact on the industry, the rulemaking process takes a long time. It is reasonable to assume that it would be at least three years before any of these standards takes effect.
