

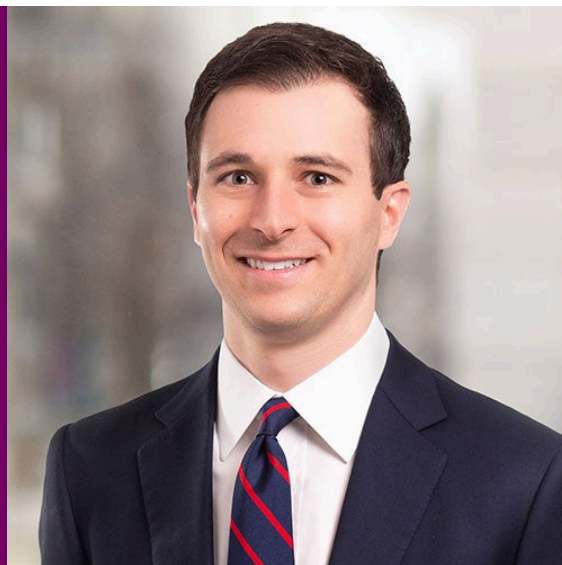

### OVERVIEW
