### OVERVIEW

David is a litigator and trial attorney who represents clients in labor and employment disputes, class actions, unfair competition, and entertainment disputes. He handles all phases of litigation, including trials and appeals.

David focuses his labor and employment practice on defending clients in a variety of disputes, including cases involving alleged independent contractor misclassification; wrongful termination; harassment; discrimination; wage and hour violations, including single-plaintiff cases, class actions, Private Attorneys General Act (PAGA) representative actions, and Fair Labor Standards Act (FLSA) collective actions; and whistleblower cases. He also advises employers on personnel matters, wage and hour issues, and other compliance issues.

David also litigates entertainment industry disputes. He has represented clients in several high-profile, reputation-defining disputes, including matters involving investigations, public relations crises, fraud, and corporate governance issues.

- Defended an environmental remediation contractor against claims by 265 plaintiffs, totaling more than \$1 billion in alleged damages, in multidistrict litigation in which over 200 depositions were taken concerning a three-million-gallon release of acid mine drainage in Colorado.
