OVERVIEW

Noah is an associate in the firm's Privacy + Cyber practice, where he represents clients in consumer law, business disputes, and commercial litigation. His practice focuses particularly on national class-action litigation arising under consumer protection statutes, including the Fair Credit Reporting Act (FCRA) and the Telephone Consumer Protection Act (TCPA).

Prior to joining the firm, Noah worked within the federal judiciary at both the trial and appellate level, first as a law clerk to the Honorable Claude Hilton of the U.S. District Court for the Eastern District of Virginia and later as a law clerk to the Honorable Daniel Manion of the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Seventh Circuit. In both roles, Noah refined his writing and analytical abilities and gained valuable firsthand knowledge of federal court procedure and operations.

Noah earned his J.D. from Regent University School of Law, where he served as editor-in-chief of the *Regent University Law Review*, graduated first in his class, and was recognized as the Outstanding Graduate for his class year.

REPRESENTATIVE MATTERS

- Successfully obtained dismissal with prejudice (at the pleadings stage) of a putative TCPA class action on behalf of a California-based medical group, in a matter in the Central District of California. The plaintiff alleged unlawful calls to her cellular phone, but the court granted the defendant's motion to dismiss, holding the communications fell within the FCC's "emergency purpose" exception because the calls were purposed to convey health- and safety-related information related to prior authorization requests from the intended recipients' physicians. The court confirmed the emergency purpose exception is broad and applies even when a call reaches a wrong number. The case was dismissed without leave to amend.
