OVERVIEW

Russell focuses his primary practice on federal regulation of gas and electricity markets, including the representation of independent power producers, electric utilities, investment firms, transmission companies, and gas pipelines and local distribution companies in proceedings before the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC) and in transactions in the energy sector. His practice includes counseling clients on federal regulatory issues in administrative complaints and litigation, energy transactions, FERC approvals for transactions, market-based rates, and rate and gas pipeline certificate proceedings, and compliance with FERC's Anti-Manipulation Rule. Russell has deep experience in FERC's regulations implementing the Federal Power Act and Public Utility Holding Company Act and in the requirements of regional transmission and market operators. Russell regularly advises clients in connection with energy-related transactions, including M&A, tax equity, and financing transactions, as well as gas pipeline precedent agreements and asset management agreements.

While attending law school, Russell interned at the U.S. Commodity Futures Trading Commission in the Division of Enforcement.
