

Representative Engagements

Representative engagements are divided into our defense of independent contractor “misclassification” lawsuits and administrative proceedings, and independent contractor “compliance” engagements.

(These engagements are in addition to our defense of dozens of other lawsuits and administrative proceedings alleging misclassification of employees as exempt from overtime or minimum wage.)

MISCLASSIFICATION

- Defending nationwide insurance company in California in jury trial involving class and representative action claims by insurance agents claiming they were misclassified as independent contractors and securing jury trial verdict in favor of client.
- Defending a courier company in three California class action lawsuits alleging the couriers were misclassified as independent contractors and were not paid overtime, minimum wage and other statutory wage benefits in violation of California Labor Code and Private Attorney Generals Act (PAGA) claims, following the filing of a motion to compel arbitration.
- Defending large ethnic baked foods company in lawsuit by distributor and helper claiming they were misclassified as independent contractors and denied rights under federal and state wage and state franchise law and securing order compelling arbitration.
